MESSAGE FROM REV'D ANASTASIA

"LIVING IN RESPONSE TO GOD'S LOVE"

Beautiful saints, planted by grace in this place, peace be with you.

Our Gospel today affirms the authority of Christ over every time, circumstance and situation. This is a reassuring word to hear amidst such uncertainty. And the hope of our calling as children of God. There are other signs of hope that God is also reassuring us with. 
